Dear Parents, Parishioners, and Friends,

On behalf of the Education Council and faculty, I am pleased to share an update from St. Agnes School. We recently enjoyed our annual Catholic Schools Week celebration, which began with a Mass held at Scott's Cobble Nordic Center and a festive afternoon of skiing, snowshoeing, and hot chocolate. Over the course of the week, our students and teachers celebrated 'faith, excellence, and service' by participating in leadership projects, taking field trips, and enjoying special activities at the school.

We continue to be grateful for the restored sense of normalcy following school years marked by pandemic restrictions and concerns. Our students are thriving. Our third graders in particular are becoming responsible leaders by organizing and participating in monthly service projects and actively mentoring younger students. Students in all grades have enjoyed re-connecting with our community during field trips to Tucker Farms, the Lake Placid Olympic Museum, the Whiteface Lodge, FISU Games, the Palace Theatre, Mt. Van Hoevenberg, and even Mirror Lake for a dog sled ride.

We are also grateful for the hard work of our talented faculty and committed parents on projects that ensure the success of the school in the following areas: curriculum and professional development; health and safety; and school climate and development. We are especially pleased to have completed the first phase of two to upgrade our electrical plant and heating and cooling systems. Projects like these keep St. Agnes a safe and inspiring place in which to learn and grow.

Enrollment is strong in our preschool and primary grades, and we expect to be fully enrolled again for the 2023-2024 school year. Many families have already enrolled for Kindergarten and grades 1-3, and we receive new preschool inquiries and applications almost daily.
